According to family tradition, had the entail on the Ballyseedy estate been conventionally followed, the heirs of Thomas Blennerhassett of Ash Hill, Ballymacelligott (b.18.12.1736) would have inherited; This did not happen because the 1774 will of "The Great Colonel John" Blennerhassett (p.B 01). while recording the Ballyseedy entail in great detail, completely omitted to include Thomas. The disinheritance is perhaps because of Thomas' inappropriate marriage, but that is uncertain.

Valerie Bary in [HK] tells us: "...Ash Hill House was built in 1700 by the Blennerhassetts, who lived there for a long time. It is probable that Thomas Blennerhassett & his wife, Alice Spring (sic - in error for Avice S.), built this house and that their son, another Thomas Blennerhassett, then inherited...";

SERJEANT THOMAS "TOM" BLENNERHASSETT

Thomas Arthur Blennerhassett was Permanent Serjeant & Paymaster of the volunteer "Kerry County Yeomanry" Elmgrove & Blennerville Unit, 1823-34; Arthur Blennerhassett of Ballyseedy House was Captain (p.B 06); He probably served earlier than 1823; was said to have been "...the finest and handsomest man in the regiment..." He "...called them in every 3 months & drilled them opposite the hall door of Ballyseedy House..." where they camped on the lawn of Ballyseedy House; his brothers John & Richard served under him as privates; The regiment was one of many volunteer corps formed in anticipation of French invasion, also serving as a police force to protect lives & property against bands of "Whiteboys" (G 54); Serjeant T.A.Blennerhassett's muster rolls for the unit, signed by him, are in National Archives at Kew, London;

William Day Blennerhassett of NZ (G 60) writing in his 1934 memorandum on Blennerhassett family, recounts a story that Serjeant Tom received a pension for his service with the Yeomanry, of which he was later deprivedfor publicly making an insulting remark about Queen Victoria, saying the country was being ruined by her...'

Thomas Blennerhassett "the disinherited" (G 0) was 3rd son of Thomas Blennerhassett & Avice Spring of Ash Hill House (pp.B 05 & K 29)

His elder brother Col.Arthur Blennerhassett succeeded to the entailed Ballyseedy estate in 1799 (p.B 05) then died at Bath in 1810, aged 79 yrs; Following his death the entailed estate, including the principal house "Elm Grove" (now called "Ballyseedy Castle") was inherited not by his younger brother Thomas (G 01) or Thomas' heirs (as could be expected under usual rules governing inheritance of entailed property by the next eldest son) , but by Thomas' 2nd cousin Arthur BH (d.1815 - p.B 07) the son of William Blennerhassett of Elm Grove;

Thomas (who if living would have been aged 73 when his bro. Arthur died in 1810) was deliberately excluded by omission from a very detailed entail contained in the 19.11.1774 will of "The Great Colonel John" BH, the entail stating that his brother Arthur was "an only son", thus implying that Thomas was disowned by the family or perhaps that his children were illegitimate; Thus was Thomas disinherited, descendants losing all right to the Ballyseedy estate; This agrees with oral tradition passed down in the Gortatlea family, that they descend from "the eldest son of the eldest son" but were "done out of the property"

Mary Agnes Hickson in [HICKSON/OKR vol.2 1874 p.56] wrote that Thomas Blennerhassett of Ballymacelligott (d.1777), the father of this Thomas (b.1736) & Arthur (b.1731 d.1810), "...has no descendants male or female living in Ireland"

The story of the disinheritance, told to this day in varying forms by different branches of the Gortatlea & Blackbriar families, was documented in 1934 by William Day Blennerhassett of New Zealand (G 60) who heard it from his father & grandmother; It tells of a Blennerhassett eldest son and heir to the Ballyseedy estate who eloped with an Irish Catholic girl to France & married her there; doing this is caused him to be disowned and disinherited, the second son becoming heir to the entailed Ballyseedy estates, the eldest given an income for life and two farms, at Gortatlea and Blackbriar, and "...thereafter the Ballyseedy family washed their hands of him..."; associated with that story is another legend, that an eldest son of Ballyseedy fell ill with fever and the family did not permit his wife to see the sick man. On being informed of her husband's death, she is said to have knelt on the steps of Ballyseedy and cursed the family, "...that the heir apparent to Ballyseedy may never see the reigning heir with a grey head..."; and so it was for six generations, until the family became extinct in the male line. Yet another version has the curse "that the heir shall always die before his 21st birthday", which is not at all the same thing; One version of the tale has the Lady of Ballyseedy House who refused entry to the widow as being named Chute (presumably of the family of Chute Hall) but as no Chutes married into the Ballyseedy Blennerhassetts, only the Blennerville Blennerhassett family, this cannot be so

William Day Blennerhassett believed that the Ash Hill, Gortatlea & Blackbriar family (p.B 05) to which he belonged descend from this "French" marriage, but part of the story does not fit well with what we know of Thomas; Thomas Blennerhassett (b.1736), although almost certainly ancestor of this branch of the family, was not an eldest son of Ballyseedy but a cousin who became heir apparent only under rules governing succession of entailed property; also, the disinherited family remained strongly Church of Ireland, as in the main it does to this day, so if the marriage was to a Catholic girl the children were not raised in her faith

Significant parts of the story better fit John Blennerhassett Jr. born c1754 (eldest son & heir of John Blennerhassett of Ballyseedy & g.son of "The Great Colonel John", p.B 01) who died of illness aged 20 years at Nice, France, a few days before 14.12.1774; certainly "...the family not permitting the wife to see her husband..." indicates that the couple were very young at the time; however, this John cannot be ancestor of the disinherited Ash Hill, Gortatlea & Blackbriar family as the dates do not fit, he was not born early enough

OTAKEHO GENERAL STORE:

Arthur W. Blennerhassett was a draper until October 1882, when with his brother William (G 13) he took over "Otakeho General Store & Bakery" as storekeepers for the district; the business had been first opened in 1881 by Mr Alexander, who died soon after from injuries received falling from his horse on Otakeho Bridge ["Hawera & Normanby Star" 28.10.1882]

Store goods were delivered to outlying settlers by packhorse; they took butter from settlers in exchange for his wares; William became first postmaster at Otakeho (Wanganui postal district) when the Post Office opened 1882, with Arthur taking over 1.1.1887 [NZG 2387 No.15 p.346]; In 1883 the store was connected to Manaia by telephone ! ["Taranaki Herald" 25.9.1883, p.2]

The store was run jointly as "Blennerhassett Brothers" (Storekeepers, Insurance and General Commission Agents") until 2.2.1887, when William retired from the business and Arthur continued on his own [NZG 13.2.1887 p.243]

In 1886 the business was offered for sale ["Evening Post 13.10.1886] and in 1890 was taken over by the Davenport brothers, but afterwards returned to Arthur W. Blennerhassett, who was still postmaster at Otakeho in 1895 [NZG 3.4.1895 p.593]

Arthur W. Blennerhassett moved from Otakeho and in 1901 purchased "Eltham and Mangatoki Stores", offering groceries, drapery, ironmongery, boots & shoes, stationery and farm produce ["Hawera & Normanby Star" 2.7.1901, p.4]; he also founded "Blennerhassett & Sons", auctioneers, land & financial agents, wine & spirit merchants, at High Street, Eltham

the Otakeho store burned down in 1928 but was rebuilt; store & post office closed in 1982

THE CASABLANCA CONFERENCE

The Casablanca Conference was held
14-29 January 1943 at Casablanca, Morocco;
At the meeting, Winston Churchill and F. D.
Roosevelt agreed on an increase in US
bombing of Germany and transfer of British
military resources to the Far East once Italy
had been defeated:

Joseph Stalin was not invited as neither Churchill or Roosevelt had on the agenda anything to do with the Eastern Front, but this failure to invite Stalin did a great deal to confirm in Stalin's mind, his belief that war plans were being made without his participation and behind his back

RECOLLECTIONS OF WILLIAM DAY BLENNERHASSETT:

in 1934 William Day Blennerhassett, at the request of his son (George) Arthur Blennerhassett, recorded in an old exercise book a memorandum of Blennerhassett family history and traditions as recalled by himself; this records many interesting stories and anecdotes of family history & tradition that had been told to WDB by his father John Blennerhassett, his grandmother Ellen Blennerhassett, and others (see p.B 05, G 01, G 54)

The original exercise book is held by WDB's grandson Craig Blennerhassett; three different summary transcriptions of the document exist, the most detailed having been transcribed by WDB's g.daughter Barbara Helen Smallfield (nee Blennerhassett). these three versions overlap, but are complementary and best read together

WILLIAM DAY BLENNERHASSETT

Prison Governor of "Shanghai Municipal (Native) Goal" at Shanghai, China, initially for three years then extended for a further three year (1903-1909); he was severely wounded during a prison mutiny 4.5.1906 (see accounts below), following which he went to Ireland on leave

he was severely wounded during a prison mutiny 4.5.1906 (see accounts below), following which he went to Ireland on leave with his wife and two youngest children, to recover from his injuries; they all returned, sailing from London to Shanghai on P&O line SS "Marmora", departing 25.4.1907 WDB's photographs of the prison still exist.

[TIMES 5.5.1906] reported:

News in Brief FIGHT IN SHANGHAI GAOL. SHANGHAI, May 4.*

Partisans of the noted brigand Vannaomao, who is undergoing 20 years' inprisonment in the municipal goal, to-day made an attack on the warders.

Mr. Blennerhasset, Governor of the prison, was severely wounded by a sword cut, and two Indian warders were badly injured. The trouble was promptly suppressed. Vannaomao and another Chinaman were killed and five Chinese were wounded.

William Day Blennerhassett's account:

"The Prison being built to house 480 convicts, it very soon became so overcrowded that it was necessary to treble the cells, which was not conducive to good dicipline amongst the prisoners and as a result they mutinied on the 4th May 1905 (error, this was 1906).

This was suppressed in a very short time by stern measures which resulted in the shooting of some 6 prisoners whilst William himself received serious injuries, after a hand-to-hand encounter with a notorious Yangtze River pirate, and would have been killed after being felled to the ground with a heavy club. One of the Indian wardens receiving with his sword a blow of a stone hammer intended for the prostrate figure and only succeeded in breaking the sword 6 inches from the hilt. The blow was aimed by the pirate after he had 2 revolver bullets in the chest from my revolver and only succumbed later to a .303 bullet and others of the ring-leaders (13) of the trouble were later sentenced to be beheaded..."
