

NOTE: Emily Mary Laye's mother was Anne Maria Teresa Walsh; she d. at Douglas, IOM & was bur. 14.9.1848 in Braddon churchyard; An Anglican, she was baptised RC on 11.9.1848, on her deathbed; After her death her children were also baptised or re-baptised RC, perhaps as a result of death-bed promise (Emily Mary Laye, her youngest child, had already been bapt. RC 9.7.1847)

Emily Mary Laye m. 2nd to John Prince, g.son of Col. John Prince; His g.father Col. John Prince was rumoured (although he always denied this) to be an illegitimate son of the Duke of Clarence (afterwards King William IV of Great Britain) and his mistress of twenty years Dorothea Bland (1762-1816) an actress, a.k.a. Mrs Jordan; The Duke of Clarence and Dorothea Bland had ten known illegitimate children who went by the surname FitzClarence, but John Prince is not one of these (see <http://www.thepeerage.com/p5254.htm> for list);
