**\*NOTE: BADEN POWELL**  
perhaps named for Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell,  
1st Baron Baden-Powell, OM, GCMG, GCVO, KCB  
b.1857 d.1941  
Lieut-General in British Army, who made his name in 1899  
during Second Boer War in South Africa by successfully  
defending the town during the Siege of Mafeking;  
known as Lord Baden-Powell or "B-P", founded the Scout  
Movement, becoming first Chief Scout of The Boy Scouts  
Association; writer, author of "Scouting for Boys"

**Arthur Blennerhassett's place of birth in Ireland:**

*in the Gaelic language "Bun", used as a prefix to a place-name, indicates a river mouth*

1. Bunnow harbour, six miles west of Sneem, Co.Kerry
2. Bunaw, Co.Kerry (south of Bunnow, by water is very near but by land much further away, on opposite peninsular)
3. Bunnahow in N. Co.Clare
4. Bunnow in Co.Clare
5. Bunnoe in Co.Cavan
6. Bunowna in Co.Sligo
7. Bunnahesco in Co.Fermanagh

Arthur was probably still in Ireland at the time of the 1840 and 1850 census; at the 1861 census he was a commercial traveller, lodging at London Tavern, Crockherbtown, Cardiff, Wales

family tradition in NZ has it that he served in army (perhaps Black Watch?); his portrait in uniform is remembered by his g.g.da Glenis Allison, hanging at the home of her g.mother Connie Blenner Hassett (Lang) at Amberley, NZ
